4 Days/3 Nights



This is a **unique opportunity** for young leaders who are passionate about human rights, international security issues and careers in international relations to **participate** in the Human Rights Council at the United Nations in Geneva. The Human Rights Council is an inter-governmental body within the UN with 47 participating member states tasked with addressing human rights

violations around the globe. There are 15-18 competitive spots for this program and the program has components **on the ship** both before Antwerp and after Le Havre that will be facilitated by UN Reform expert and Political Science **Professor Michael Fowler**. **This is an exclusive leadership opportunity that requires an application.** This special opportunity has been arranged by Dr. Ariel R. King, an SAS alumnae who is a current UN representative for the Department of Economic and Social Affairs and the Worldwide Organization for Women. Ariel is also the founder of **Ariel Foundation International** and has been working in child advocacy for 30 years.

Students will fly to Geneva and enjoy a private orientation at the Palais des Nations and receive a briefing about schedule and expectations. The group will meet with delegates of the Human Rights Council and will generate actual input into the **"Right to Development"** agenda with a collective response that will be published with the Youth and the UN series from Ariel Foundation International and presented at the United Nations in New York at the beginning of December. In addition, students are granted **exclusive access** to attend various Human Rights Council sessions that will take place on September 13. There may also be time to explore some of the many prominent organizations in the same area including the Red Cross Museum, World Health Organization, World Trade Organization, etc.



After the invigorating and challenging sessions, enjoy Saturday afternoon on your own. Geneva is known as one of the prettiest cities in the world sitting amidst the purple Savoy Alps, Mount Blanc and Lake Geneva. Also known as a center for global relations and finance, Geneva is the second most populous city in Switzerland.

Rejoin the ship in France, but not before spending the afternoon and evening (meals at your own expense) in Paris on the way.

Travel across two borders (Netherlands and Germany) to the town of Oberhausen, where Friedensdorf (Peace Village in English) is located. Friedensdorf has the look of a fresh air camp, where inner-city children gather for a week of fun and games.

It is much more than that. This is a place where child victims of war (many from Angola or Afghanistan) come to heal.

Spend approximately 3.5 hours visiting this remarkable “camp,” learn about their mission and their specific goals to improve the physical situations of hurting children from around the world. Hear their stories and interact with some of the children. (The international language of a smile, a game of chalk tic-tac-toe or soccer will have to suffice, as almost none of the children speak English.) **PLEASE NOTE: You are requested to bring craft materials and your creativity for craft/playtime with the kids.**

Before leaving Oberhausen, visit the Gasometer, an industrial monument that symbolizes the whole area. Built in the late 1920's, Europe's largest disc-type gas holder is an impressive reminder of the heavy industry that characterized the Ruhr region for more than a century. Moreover, the artist Christo's Big Air Package has been installed in the Gasometer <http://www.gasometer.de/en/> from the 16th of March until the 30th of December 2013. After this visit, your coach will bring you back to the ship in Antwerp.

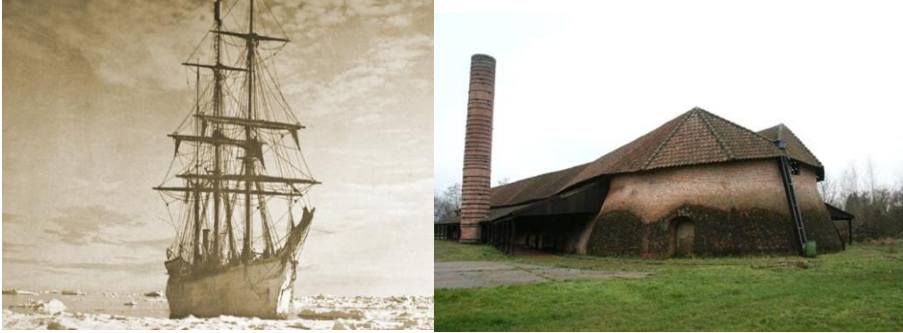

For those who are interested in history, ships and traditional brickwork or construction methods, this is the ideal hands-on program. Upon arrival in Boom, a village on the outskirts of Antwerp, your education begins with an informative walk to introduce you to the world of ship building and brick making and how both are connected. At noon, a typical Belgian lunch will be served, horse stew with salad and French fries. Then you can get to work!

In groups of 10 students, you will receive assignments in the three neighboring non-profit organization, respectively 't Geleeg', the region's Brickwork Museum, 'Emabb', Ecomuseum and Archives of the Boom Brickworks, and 'The New Belgica', an organization that is building a replica of the three-master Belgica, known from the historic South Pole Expedition of Adrien de Gerlache (1897-1899), within the scope of educational and employment problem solving. Tasks will include painting, maintenance, wood work, and cooperation with the volunteers and people in search of employment.

After completing this undoubtedly satisfying project, a coach will bring you back to the ship and allow you to continue your journey, hopefully with a broader scope on life.

The center was created in 2005 and provides childcare, education, recreation, spiritual fulfillment and a nurturing environment for children in need. Here, volunteers teach children to make different crafts, jewelry, music, sewing, etc. to enhance

their skills so that eventually they may find in these new activities a way of achieving future income. The volunteers also organize fundraising events for the community center (with the participation of children). The center opens its doors to the students, allowing them to interact with children and volunteers by participating in daily tasks and activities.

Conviven Community Centre The objective of recreational workshops is to help the children have fun in a healthy way, relate and integrate socially and let their imagination soar. Children who live in socially and economically marginalized communities in conditions of extreme poverty and without significant stimulation, affection, or quality time with adults often acquire either aggressive or extremely shy behaviors. Many of them often suffer from delayed maturity.

Through recreation and play, children form the foundations of their moral and ethical development, as well as their critical thinking abilities. Furthermore, responsible recreation helps facilitate a healthy maturation process and encourages sound judgment. The recreational workshops cover four activity areas: outdoor games, board games, arts and crafts, and story reading. You are encouraged to bring a special talent that they would like to share (a game, a book, a song, guitar, etc) or you may simply participate and interact with the kids in any other activity of the day.

Born in Argentina, Pope Francis is the first Latin American to lead the Roman Catholic Church, as well as the first Jesuit. Known as the “Pope of the Poor,” he worked hard in the “villas miserias” (slums) to recover the young generations from a life of crime and drugs, and give them opportunities for a better life. This tour will lead you to

see his birthplace and home of his childhood, his school, the seminary where he did his ecclesiastic studies and was ordained priest, the slums where he would work for the poor people, the subway in which he would travel even as a cardinal, and the Church of the Immigrants in La Boca where he worked hard with local cooperatives. Learn also about his relationship with the current Argentine government, and how his new assignment has affected it. Our tour ends as we meet with representatives of a Civil Association to learn about the social problems they face and work to improve, particularly against drugs in the slums, human trafficking, and slavery. **After learning about the organization, we will help prepare and serve lunch to the families they assist.**

Townships in South Africa came about as a result of apartheid city-planning policies, which excluded ‘non-white’ people from living in the suburbs of the city. They were forcibly moved to peripheral areas on the edge of the city, where they had to live in harsh conditions and cope with extreme poverty. Although apartheid officially ended in 1994, many people still face harsh conditions from the consequences of poverty. Despite struggling, the townships are filled with a strong sense of community, vibrancy, and faith. There is a growing hope as many redefine their futures within and beyond the boundaries of the township.



Tambo Village is a small, contained community, located within the Gugulethu Township where everyone knows each other and lives within walking distance, making it an ideal homestay location. This homestay project is owned and operated by community members who have a vested interest in the comfort and safety of their guests.

Tambo houses are built out of brick and mortar and have running water, flush toilets, and electricity. Accommodations are simple and geysers (water heaters) are not standard; bathing in some houses is either with cold water or with water heated up on the stove. Participants will share a room with another SAS participant. Meals, linen and bedding are provided by the host family. The food quality is excellent and special dietary needs may be catered to upon request.

Note: At the village’s request, this trip is not suitable for children under 12 years of age.

After departing the quayside, a 45min coach transfer on the N2 National Highway will take you to into the Baphumelele Orphanage, located in the bustling township of Khayelitsha.



Founded in 2001, Baphumelele Children's Home was a humble woman's response to an alarming situation. Rosie Mashale had no money when she decided to provide a home and place of safety for children who were orphaned, abandoned, abused or neglected, but she had a vision, a big heart, a lot of resolve, and the constant support of her community. At present the children - ranging in age from newborn to 19 years old - live in nine separate buildings. They are cared for by women

and men from the community who love them as their very own, and who are supported by volunteers.

The sustainability and unique nature of Baphumelele as a community-based project is assured through its deep roots in the community. The Home in particular is viewed by many as a sentinel of hope in the townships of the Western Cape and a demonstration of what a community can achieve when everyone works together.

At the orphanage, if she is available, you will be met by the founding member of the establishment, Rosie Mashale, who will offer a brief tour of the orphanage coupled with an explanation as to what it aims to achieve. Once you are familiar with the establishment, the group will be split up to assist with various activities taking place throughout the orphanage, including infant minding, playing with toddlers, reading to the children, general handiwork, and meal preparation in the kitchen.

After completing the various tasks assigned, bid farewell to the children at the orphanage and transfer to Langa for a cycling tour and a visit to the Happy Feet Project where you will meet the founder, Siviwe Mbinda and enjoy a performance by the kids. Happy Feet Youth Project is a NPO founded in 2007 by Siviwe Mbinda in an effort to provide a safe after-school environment for the children of his community. The program includes approximately 70 boys and girls ages 3-20.

PLEASE NOTE: Restroom facilities are extremely limited in the Township; please use facilities prior to departure.

Most of the sites visited on this tour are part of an African Township, which whilst having extreme poverty, is busy being uplifted by the government and the local community, making it a place of hope. One needs to be prepared for this aspect of the tour, as it is definitely a "no frills" experience.

Through participating in this tour, you will receive an insight into the local African culture like no other you have ever experienced, and in doing so, will contribute to the economic uplifting so vital for the people of South Africa.

Join **Professor Jeanne Siler** on this program to discover the charm and incredibly warm hospitality of Ghanians in Winneba, a coastal town of 40,000. Your visit will help foster the positive relationship that Winneba shares with Charlottesville, Virginia through the sister cities program.

Ghana's College of Education and the National Academy of Music is in Winneba and affords the opportunity for students to meet local leaders and local students. **This overnight experience provides ample occasions for reciprocal cross-cultural exchange.** Welcome a delegation of your Winneba hosts, city officials, residents, and students, aboard the MV Explorer and eat lunch together before continuing the lively conversation on

the 2.5 hour bus ride back to Winneba. Use the travel time to sit next to and really get to know one of your Ghanian hosts before your arrival is celebrated with a traditional welcome ceremony and a drumming and dance performance. Tour the University of Education before enjoying a dinner of local cuisine with Winneba students and faculty. Linger after the meal with your new friends or spend the evening exploring the town independently.

Participate in the sister-city focused mission of reading and writing promotion by engaging in a Team Writing Seminar with Professor Siler and local leaders, or a reading activity with children at a local school or similar location. Delight in unique local flavors once again for lunch before returning to the ship on October 17, a full day before departure October 18 at 1800.

Please note: Other cultural activities may be included and/or substituted. Please bring local currency for any optional purchases you may wish to make in Winneba. If you are dance or musically inclined, prepare to trade performances and/or actively participate with Ghanians. 200 copies of beloved children's book, **Goodnight Moon**, will be available to read and distribute to children as part of the reading program. NIMA STREET ART TOUR & INTERACTION

Full Day



In Ghana, one of the richest cultural hubs of Africa, an urban street art movement is rapidly emerging. At the heart of this movement in the capital city of Accra is the youth art program Nima Muhinmanchi Art (NMA). NMA is a grassroots organization that provides free after-school art workshops to youth in Ghana and beautifies communities through public art. NMA is based in Nima, the largest Muslim metropolis in Accra, an under-developed area with a high population density and limited access to water and electricity. NMA's efforts for cultural transformation have played a key role in the budding urban renewal, diversity, and social stability of the community.

On the Nima Street Art Tour, we will begin the day with a walking tour of NMA's gorgeous mural paintings, which have vivified schools, parks, highways, and even a public toilet (photo ops aplenty). Along the way, we will have a unique insider's chance to soak in the maze of winding, red-dirt Nima roads. At the end of the tour, students will split up into pairs to enjoy a traditional Hausa meal at the home of individual NMA artist families. We will reconvene at NMA headquarters for art workshops with NMA youth, where we will be invited to pick up a brush and paint or practice photography alongside NMA youth (all levels of experience welcome).

As the visual arts wind down, we will turn up the funk. A day in Nima, known for its glorious street music festivals and home to Ghana's illest rappers, would not be complete without music and dancing. Our special session will include a guest visit by a local hip hop star, and a tailored azonto dance lesson, the musical-dance craze that originated in Ghana and is sweeping across clubs in London, Amsterdam, and South Africa. At the close of NMA workshops, we will amble over to the neighboring park (the site of an "NMA Mural for Peace") for downtime, pickup soccer, and snacks of hand-cut mango and fresh sobolo juice, a local specialty made from hibiscus flower.

The objective of this program is to explore culture as a tool for urban renewal, as well as to experience the richness and diversity of life in what many consider to be a slum. The artists and guides are all English-speaking, though we will have the chance to pick up a few Hausa and pidgin slang expressions.

The capital of Ghana since 1877, Accra is also the capital of the Greater Accra Region and the country's most populous city. The site of present-day Accra includes the original Ga town as well as British, Danish, and Dutch forts, and their surrounding communities. On this tour, you will drive through the administrative and economic districts of Accra and visit the W.E.B. Dubois Center for Pan

African Culture. The center houses the mausoleum, personal library, and museum. Next you will visit the Artiste Alliance, Independence/Black Star Square, and Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Park, after which, **you will have lunch** in a local Ghanaian restaurant. Your tour ends at the Arts Center, where you will have the opportunity to use your bargaining skills while shopping in an open-air market for artifacts from Ghana and West Africa.
